A Message From Our Library Director:

Ricardo Pino

For many of us, the arrival of every September brings with it familiar rituals or patterns. These are often comforting in the sense of normalcy they provide.

And then there's September 2020.

One of the most familiar patterns, of course, is having our children going back to school. It is also one of the patterns most disrupted by current events. We at WPL know that we have a role to play in trying to smooth over that disruption, and supporting Wayne's school-children. To that end, we are piloting two services whose details we are working on to introduce next week:

First, we are aiming to ensure that all Wayne schoolchildren and teachers have a digital library card to access all of the library's digital resources. Doing so, we can broaden the reach students have and grant them access to resources needed to support their school-work. We have partnered with both High Schools to implement the program, and hope to take the lessons learned from the pilot to expand to all of Wayne's schools.

Second, we will be dedicating space in our building for tutoring sessions and small group study sessions in 2-hour blocks. Sessions must be reserved ahead of time, and only during the specified blocks of time. We will release information, sign ups, and policies about this offering in the next few days. We will only be able to continue to offer this if all mandated public health behaviors (e.g., social distancing, face mask usage) are properly followed.

Many of us are longing to return to a sense of how things used to be, and we're no different. To that end, starting on September 13, 2020, we will reopen for our standard Sunday hours.

In addition, we are anticipating that in October:

- We will resume full operating hours, including all standard evenings
- Statewide interlibrary loan delivery services will resume, so that we can get items for you from other partner libraries who are also open.

We will announce those details as soon as they are finalized, so please be on the lookout.

Thank you all for your continued support and patience while we adapt how we provide service and work out new ways to meet your needs!

Please let us know if you will be picking up the items yourself, or if you are designating someone else to pick up materials for you.



NJ GENERAL ELECTION COVID-19 RESPONSE

Understanding Governor Murphy's Executive Order #177 regarding the November 3rd General Election. Visit LWVNJ.org for updates!



AUTOMATIC VOTE-BY-MAIL

The election will be conducted primarily via vote-by-mail ballots, which will be sent to all active registered voters without the need for an application to receive a vote-by-mail ballot. All ballots will have prepaid postage.



ONLINE VOTER REGISTRATION

Online voter registration will be available on September 4, 2020. The deadline to register to vote is October 13th. Make sure to check your voter registration status by visiting nj.gov/state/elections.

POLLING LOCATIONS

Each municipality will be required to open at least one in-person polling site. All counties must ensure that at least 50% of their total polling places are open. **Any voter who chooses to cast their vote in-person will do so using a provisional ballot.** All individuals with disabilities will have access to an ADA-conforming voting machine.

RETURNING VOTE- BY-MAIL BALLOTS

All ballots will be mailed from County Clerks by Monday, October 5th. Voters will be able to return ballots by mail, by depositing it in a secure drop box, or by handing it directly to a poll worker at a polling place on Election Day. All ballots being returned through the mail must be postmarked by November 3rd and received no later than 8 pm on November 10th. Ballots that lack postmarks due to postal error received by November 5th will be valid.



DROP BOX LOCATIONS

To the extent possible, each county will have at least 10 secure ballot drop boxes in locations that are readily accessible to the registered voters within the county.



NO SAMPLE BALLOTS

Voters will receive notification about their polling place location, secure ballot drop box locations, and information about how to obtain or view a sample ballot. This notification will be mailed by October 23rd.

*Patty Slezak recommends a documentary ...***A Man Named Pearl** (available through Hoopla)

This is an incredible and uplifting documentary about Pearl Fryar who found a unique way of confronting bigotry and racism in 1976 in South Carolina. Having moved to Bishopville for a nearby job, he and his wife looked for a house to buy and were notified that a black family was not welcome because "black people don't keep up their yards." Stung by the racial stereotype, he did not become angry or embittered; he purchased a house in a "black" neighborhood and began a project that has lasted decades—he fashioned a garden that not only attracts positive attention, but brings tourism to the town and area by creating a



world class topiary garden. Pearl Fryar continues to be an inspiration to his community and to all who visit. As Pearl's minister, Rev. Jerome McCray, says of the garden: "It's the one place in all of South Carolina that people can go, both black and white, and feel love."

*Janette Pardo recommends a TV Series ...***Schitt's Creek** (Seasons 1-3 on DVD at WPL)


The premise is simple, when the Rose family loses their fortune they are forced to move to the podunk town of Schitt's Creek. But it's the evolution of the Rose family as they come to accept and embrace the town and its citizens that is at the heart of this brilliant series. I spent my stay at home time this spring binge watching this superb series. I will admit to not being hooked by the very first episode but I am certainly happy that I stuck with it. The main characters are all over-the-top but the growth and development of each character throughout the six seasons is what makes this series shine. I urge everyone to please "visit" Schitt's Creek so that you, too, can fall in love with its inhabitants.

*Janine Rinaldi recommends a movie ...***Steel Magnolias** (available on DVD at the WPL)

I have seen this wonderful film so many times and I like how it portrays the mother/child bond and the complex relationships/friendships between women. Released in 1989 and starring an all ensemble cast including Julia Roberts, Sally Field, Shirley Maclaine, Olympia Dukakis, among others. A warm and witty comedy-drama, it is not to be missed!

*Patty Slezak recommends a documentary ...***Making Waves** (available through Hoopla)

Have you every watched an awards program and wonder why awards were given for sound mixing and sound editing? This documentary will give you a true appreciation of this craft and help one understand how important this aspect is to the movie process.





The Restorer kicks off the southern gothic mystery series, The Graveyard Queen. Amelia Grey is a graveyard restorer who can also see ghosts. Detective John Devlin is haunted by two ghosts who follow him everywhere. When Amelia gets involved in the murder that John is investigating the two grow close. So close that the ghost who follow John soon start to haunt Amelia, too.


I highly recommend this chilling ghost story. There are six books in this series, so far, #2 – *The Kingdom*, #3 – *The Prophet*, #4 *The Visitor*, #5 *The Awakening* and #6 *The Sinner*. The Ballad of Songbirds and Snakes by Suzanne Collins is the prequel of the YA best-selling *Hunger* Games series & blockbuster movies. The narration is top notch and brings you back, even after a lapse of years since the books & movies came out, to the dystopian sci-fi which this year does not seem too far-fetched anymore!



This mystery series will appeal to fans of Lee Child, Michael Connelly and Linwood Barclay.




The Plot Thickens

When was the last time you sat down and reread one of your favorite books? For me rereading my favorite stories and meeting up with those characters that I can never forget is a true joy. Getting to spend time with the Gaither sisters from Rita Williams-Garcia's award winning OwnVoices trilogy has brightened my days, bringing a smile to my face every time I turn the page. Starting with *One Crazy Summer*, Williams-Garcia introduces us to Delphine, Vonetta and Fern, three sisters who are on their way to visit their mother in California in the 1960s. *P.S. Be Eleven* and *Gone Crazy in Alabama* continue the journey these sisters take as they deal with growing up, confronting racism, learning about their family history and discovering that although they may not always get along, their sisterly bond can never be broken. Williams-Garcia weaves in the Black Panther Movement, the Jackson Five, the moon landing and other details that bring the time period to life. Reading these stories, the characters are so alive that it seems impossible to me that they are only in the pages of the book and not out in the world living their lives. Several years ago I was lucky enough to meet Rita Williams-Garcia at a book festival. She was truly gracious and it was so exciting to tell her how much I loved her books. Although written for middle-graders, I would recommend these books for readers of any age who are looking for well-written stories with memorable characters. As the youngest sister Fern would say, you surely must check out these wonderful stories!
